What is homelessness?

While it may seem that homelessness is obvious - it is rather a thorny issue. We all know the homelessness of sleeping rough, of literally having nowhere to go and of being forced to sleep on the streets. And this terrible plight has been a priority for SCP - to get women off the streets and into a home. But there are many other categories of homelessness as well.

There is couch -surfing - where women are moving around among the houses of friends - sleeping on couches, in sheds, on verandahs etc. This is distressing and demoralizing and as many women report - it can also mean the end of a good friendship. It might be OK in an emergency, but couch surfers are an argument away from the streets - and they certainly count as homeless

Then there are women sleeping in their cars - often with kids. And they most definitely see themselves as homeless - even if they don't show up on the streets!

There are women in tents and humpies, and even caravans - and although this may constitute a degree of shelter - it isn't secure, and it isn't home.

And then there are women living in frightening circumstances, who are menaced by domestic violence but who have nowhere to go. They don't have the shelter and security of their own space - their own home.

And it isn't just a home that they need: homelessness can be so traumatising that a range of support services can be required - particularly to start with.

Once women have been homeless and sleeping rough, providing emergency accommodation or longer-term shelter is generally not enough in itself to help them reclaim their security and the direction of their lives. With experiences of domestic violence, sexual abuse, family breakdown, ill health -- and just not having enough money to survive on your own, many need emotional support, counselling, financial assistance - and even life skills if they are to find their way back to independent living, and be in a position to sustain their tenancy. And there just aren't enough of these vital support services

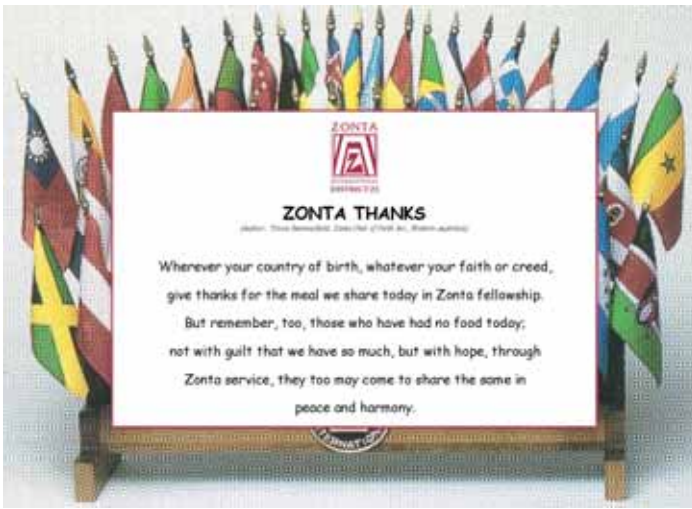
